**PO 2 Essential Subjects**

EO 1 (pg. 2-1) – Observe Young Marines Uniform Regulations

Uniform Regulations – The Young Marines uniform is worn during Young Marine Drills (meetings) or other authorized Young Marine activities as determined by the Unit Commander.

EO 2 (pg. 2-4) – Observe Grooming and Personal Appearance Standards

Male Young Marines – Hair will be neat and closely trimmed

Female Young Marines – Hair may touch the collar, but will not fall below the collar's lower edge

Jewelry – Males are permitted to wear watches, medical items, religious medallions, class or Young Marines ring.

Females are permitted to wear watches, medical items, religious medallions, class or Young Marines rings, along with small, polished ball or round stud earrings. Only one earring will be worn on or in each earlobe in the lowest hole.

EO 3 (pg. 2-6) – Be able to recite the Pledge of Allegiance, Young Marine Obligation and Creed

EO 4 (pg. 2-9) – Identify the rank structure in the Young Marines

Know ranks in order and what the Insignia looks like
